How the LEA will Ensure Continuity of Services?

The LEA will ensure continuity of services by maintaining compliance with all state and CDC guidelines on a regular basis. Several school leaders will be tasked with weekly and monthly check-ins to state agencies and other committed LEA's to ensure this continuity.

Students' Needs:

Academic Needs	The school will provide three internal benchmark tests using NWEA. Additionally, the school will utilize resources within the ESS department to further identify the needs of kids and respond with daily intervention and enrichment activities for all students accordingly.
Social, Emotional and Mental Health Needs	The school will employ a Campus Dean that will have a focus placed on identifying the social, emotional, and mental health needs of students above and beyond existing ESS/ELL requirements. This will take place through daily visits in classrooms, daily discussions with teachers, and communications with parents. The Dean and School Principal will create strategies to "mentor" these students with the assistance of paraprofessionals and other school staff.
Other Needs (which may include student health and food services)	The school will work closely with state and community agencies to ensure access to resources. These resources will be applied to students that need additional supports with health and food insecurities. The school employs a Family Director that will coordinate these strategies.

Staff Needs:

Social, Emotional and Mental Health Needs	The school will work with all staff to ensure they are not suffering from social, emotional, and mental health needs. If a staff member is identified as having a need the HR representative will work with the School Principal to identify relevant and applicable resources need to assist.
Other Needs	The school will not limit itself to social, emotional, and mental health concerns. If any other concern is identified the school leadership will address those too and will do so in a manner consistent with other strategies.

- (b)(i) During the period of the ARP ESSER award established in section Start Printed Page 212022001(a) of the ARP Act, an LEA must regularly, but no less frequently than every six months (taking into consideration the timing of significant changes to CDC guidance on reopening schools), review and, as appropriate, revise its plan for the safe return to in-person instruction and continuity of services.

 - (iii) Upon request by a parent who is an individual with a disability as defined by the ADA, provided in an alternative format accessible to that parent
